 The lawsuit seeks to "ensure that all qualified Americans have an equal opportunity to serve in the United States military, that transgender individuals are free from arbitrary and invidious discrimination, and that the constitutional rights of transgender individuals to autonomy, privacy, and freedom of expression are respected and protected."
- Following the horrific shootings at Pulse nightclub in Orlando, a blood drive was held in our San Francisco office.
- Welcomed LGBTQ clients to a gala fundraising dinner held by a UK charity that assists LGBTQ homeless youth in crisis.
