Pro Bono Commitment to Veterans and Service Members

Our firm maintains a robust pro bono practice through which we support and advocate on behalf of active-duty US service members and veterans of the armed forces. Through a longstanding partnership with the National Veterans Legal Service Program, more than 350 Latham lawyers across 15 offices have taken on over 240 matters on behalf of veterans and active-duty service members in the past five years — helping ensure that those who have served their country receive the benefits they deserve. We have also been instrumental in helping non-citizen veterans of the military as they become eligible to naturalize as US citizens, and our lawyers are working to combat the federal government's policy banning transgender individuals from serving in the military. Our pro bono work takes many forms, but all of it recognizes and honors the sacrifices of those who serve, or have served, in the armed forces.
