What are some of the department's most satisfying successes of the past year and why?

We were honored to win the first Litigators of the Week competition of 2025 for securing a complete jury trial victory for Sarepta Therapeutics in a patent dispute against Nippon Shinyaku, turning a \$290 million claim into a \$116 million victory. The patent at issue pertained to Sarepta's groundbreaking treatment for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD), a genetic disorder that causes progressive muscle degeneration, primarily affecting young boys and is often considered a death sentence. The verdict protects and preserves access to this vital treatment for DMD patients and their families.

We regularly achieve exceptional trial results at the US International Trade Commission (ITC) as well, where we have represented both American and foreign companies as complainants and



respondents in numerous investigations and trials over patents and trade secrets. Notably, we achieved a trial victory for Netgear at the ITC in a patent dispute with TP-Link, which resulted in a favorable settlement that led to Netgear's stock price jumping more than 30% in one day.
