## Litigator of the Week Runners-Up and Shout-Outs

➤ Shout-out to lawyers representing Apple, Visa and Mastercard who fought off an antitrust lawsuit accusing the companies of colluding to prop up the fees charged to merchants for point-of-sale transactions. U.S. District Judge David Dugan in East St. Louis, Illinois, granted the defendants' motions to dismiss last month, finding that Apple did not agree to refrain from creating its own payment network or to bar competitors from accessing Apple Wallet and its contactless payments technology. After the plaintiffs opted not to file an amended complaint, Dugan entered judgment for the defendants this week.
